VISITORS CONCERNS:

• Linda McMurtry regarding the swimming area near the Blue Dock. Can anything be done to make that a better place? The board has had no official discussion regarding this topic. Linda suggested some sort of net to prevent dead fish from coming in - maybe rake the area or possibly use a pool skimmer. If Linda completes the raking, Joe will make sure the raked weeds are removed from the area.

- Linda McMurtry regarding AirBnb's. She has parking concerns due to the renters. Can we make more parking? Kris states there is an additional parking plan being worked on. Tom states parking problem areas need to be made specific. Discussion concluded with the parking spots expected to be paved by Hulme at the end of July.
- Joe Szwaczkowski proposes the dump area be more accessible and leave the gate open for folks to use. Joe offers to monitor it from his home. Dump should be used for leaves and boat storage – no more tires or other debris. Joe and Derrick have cleaned up the area. Could potentially be used as a picnic area. Kris proposes getting a digital lock to open the gate with combination available online to SLI residents.
- Joe Szwaczkowski regarding garbage. Joe would like to have a notice created for use to
 folks who do not use garbage stickers. Garbage should be put in trash cans. Animals tear
 open the bags and Joe/Derrick should not need to clean up the bags that are town open.
 Kevin will draw up a letter for this use. Garbage stickers can be mentioned at the new
 resident meeting.

DASNY "SAM" GRANT - Kris Schultz

Approximately six months ago, we began to motivate politicians to move our \$100K grant. In the meantime, the roof may fail. We can do work on the roof now without forfeiting the grant money. Once the funds are released, we can be reimbursed. \$175K is now the cost to complete the work. A supplemental grant could be received only after the SAM grant has been received. DASNY confirmation has been received with two stipulations: 1) take out a

loan for no longer than a year, and 2) follow the same procedures to track invoicing, etc. Once agreement is executed, we can proceed with reimbursement. Will work with American and Megan. American does have time this year to work on the roof. Grant Committee will shift focus to seek out supplemental grants. Gutters are not included. The floor grant has been closed out. Awaiting reimbursement. Will finance this out of World Choice investments. Kevin and Loren met with Senator Barelli,.He feels that the chances of us receiving the funds this year is pretty low. Funds are "hung up". Very frustrating situation. Kris will pursue details. Looking for 4-5 volunteers that will work through these details with the group, i.e., tear off, replace shingles only, etc. Work will be done after season is over. Jackie Kraft suggested that news reporters get involved. Kevin feels that could potentially backfire on us.

Grant committee needs direction from the board.

BOOKKEEPER/REGISTER'S REPORT – Craig Bateman

Craig recommends that all permits and property transfers be recorded through the website for the public to view. Some are done via trustee email not at board meetings.

Property Transfers

- Approved June 5, 2023 Greg Franklin, 6988(29) Haven Avenue, to Michael Hoffner. Property has closed.
- Approved June 10, 2023 Swede, 5994 Camp Road, to Hulme.
- Deed recording error Potter to Hennig. SLI needs to approve so SLI can sign the deed that we have no ownership. North half of Lot 129 (16'6" x 33'0"). Quit Claim Deed to be created stating that SLI has no ties to this property. Motion to be made that SLI have no claim to this property clearing the title on the land. Discussion ensued with map provided for board to view. Motion made by Tom Kraft that SLI has no claim and authorize the president to sign a Quit Claim Deed. Seconded by Bill Schaefer. All in favor.
- Needs approval Hennig, 6985(34) Embury Avenue, to Nancy and Grant Lesswing. Kevin explained to Nancy that property may be used as a potential part-time AirBnB. Nancy can be added to the rental list. Kris explained the entire process to visitors. Visitor discussion ensued. Motion by Bob Cook to approve the sale. Seconded by Kris Schultz. All in favor.

Permits

- Penman dock replacement was approved.
- Gilbert, 6956(5) Camp Road, permit to repair foundations and roof change was approved.
- Jeff Johnson, 3843(12) Thompson Avenue. Trees and building permit update for addition on house. Survey required. Trees are to be ribbon-wrapped by owner to identify. Topic tabled.
- Rental waiting list currently at 7
- Back taxes currently at three one deceased, one on payments, and one unpaid
- 2023 taxes a little over half have been received, approximately 60%.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Executive – Kevin Colburn

• Marijuana proposal to 2.2.2. Kevin spoke with the sheriff earlier this week about it. Under NYS law you are allowed to grow a reasonable amount of marijuana as long as it for personal use. Up to five plants per adult in the household is considered reasonable. The reason Kevin wants to ban it growing outside is that anyone, even children, could access it. The sheriff said he thought that was prudent. Motion to approve by Kris Schultz. Seconded by Julie Hoffner. All in favor. Kevin proceeded to read the proposal:

2.2.0 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND MARIJUANA

- 2.2.1 The use or sale of alcoholic beverages or marijuana on the private roads, or the possession of alcoholic beverages or marijuana on public Institute property, including leased waterfront spaces, is prohibited.
- 2.2.2 Growing marijuana outside is prohibited. Growing marijuana inside a permanent structure (i.e., a house) is allowed as long as it does not violate any New York State laws.
- Kevin signed a check as donation to the SLA Golf Tournament.

- World Choice is \$77,743.49 as of 5/31/23; down \$3K year to date

- Discussion of grants in process

- Epworth Phase II floor grant has been finished and closed out. Everything sent to the state. Promise of 45-day receipt.
- Looking into program to use Epworth as source of revenue
- TAC/TAG grant items missing for Hoag. Paperwork needs to be updated? (Contact Kris for further information). Kris explained several issues with the Hoag building.
- Western NY Foundation Rosie Shader presented this at the May 20 board meeting
- Awaiting to hear about the requested sea serpent historic marker from Legends and Lore (Pomeroy)
- Awaiting word on the requested \$40K for the Epworth French drain from the Margaret L. Wendt Foundation
- NYSCA grant for capital work opens this fall. Executive board will discuss opportunities
- We went after monies for the Epworth roof shingles through a class action claim against BP Canada. Expect to be notified by June 18. Hopefully \$4K to \$5K
- Landmark Society of WNY offered to provide a loan to help with the Epworth roof.
 Megan Klem will reach out to the Executive Board.
