Joan Maddison: Personal research on our history at Silver Lake. After 2 years information was sent away to Rochester Historic & National Historic Society. May 16, 1978 SLI received acceptance from the National registry of Historic places. Joan was approached by several residents asking why their houses were not accepted. It was discovered that houses and boat houses along the Lakefront on Lakeview Ave. made modern extensions to their residences so they were excluded. Joan asked that the historic district in the Silver Lake Institute be expanded. Board agreed that would be looked into in our long-range plan.

Tom Kraft proceeded into a discussion with the board and guests as to some ideas for long-range plans for the Silver Lake Institute:

Loren Penman: Communication with town officials needs to be explored. Better relationship with County zoning office.

Brad Huber: More trees need to be planted in the Institute to replace ones being taken down.

Larry Beaman: Maintenance on the Blue Dock

Kevin Colburn: More programs for younger kids

Peggy Phillips: Concern over storage of records.
